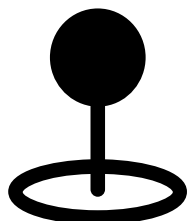
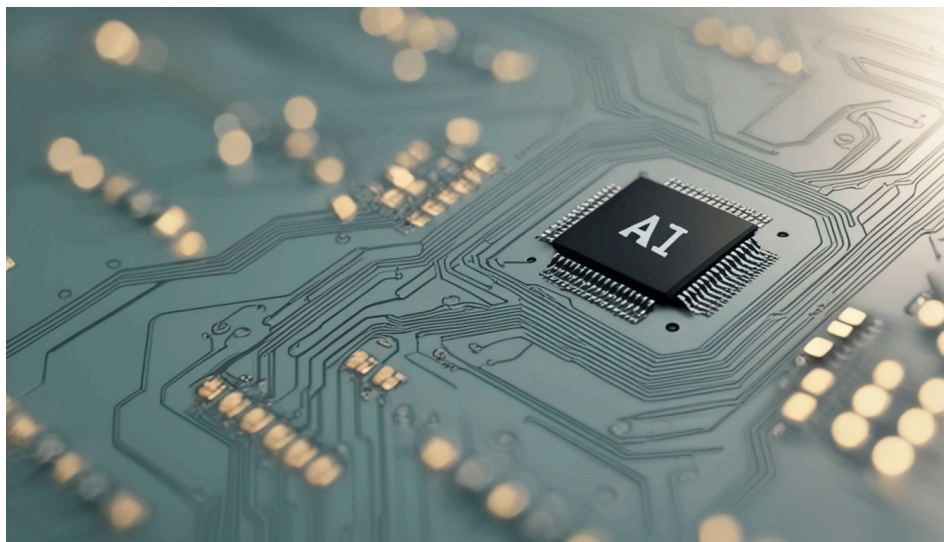

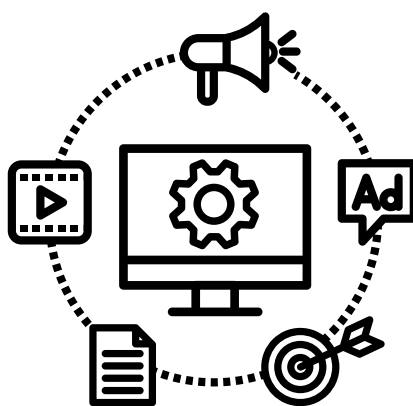
Innovating Education with Artificial Intelligence

This project focuses on strengthening educators' capacity to understand and use artificial intelligence (AI) in education in a meaningful and practical way. Although many educators are already familiar with AI tools and applications, research and consultations carried out during the project preparation phase have shown that this awareness often remains superficial. Educators frequently lack the confidence, knowledge, and guidance needed to use AI effectively in their teaching practices.

The project addresses this gap by exploring what artificial intelligence is, how it works, and how it can support learning processes, rather than treating AI as a purely technical or abstract concept. A key challenge identified is that AI has not yet been fully integrated into education systems, leaving educators without structured support or professional development opportunities.

Within this context, the project aims to support educators in developing a clear understanding of AI concepts, improving their technical and pedagogical skills, and learning how to integrate AI tools into their teaching in an ethical, responsible, and learner-centered way. Through practical activities, peer learning, and guided exploration, participants will be encouraged to reflect on the role of AI in education and to experiment with concrete applications that can be adapted to their own educational environments.

Overall, the project seeks to empower educators to move from basic awareness to confident and informed use of AI, enabling them to respond more effectively to current educational needs and future challenges.





ABOUT CORDOBA

Córdoba is a medium-sized city located in the Andalusia region of southern Spain, known for its strong historical layers, academic presence, and distinct urban character. With a population of around 325,000, the city functions as an important regional center for education, public administration, and cultural life.

How to Reach Córdoba, Spain

Córdoba is located in southern Spain, in the Andalusia region, and is well connected to major Spanish cities by train and bus. International participants can reach Córdoba easily by combining air travel with land transportation.

By Air

Córdoba does not have an international airport. The most commonly used airports are:

- Seville Airport (SVQ) – approx. 140 km
- Málaga Airport (AGP) – approx. 165 km
- Madrid–Barajas Airport (MAD) – approx. 400 km (best option for international flights)

From these airports, participants can continue their journey to Córdoba by train or long-distance bus.

From Seville Airport, travelers can reach Seville city center by bus and then take a train to Córdoba.

From Málaga Airport, trains and buses connect Málaga with Córdoba several times a day.

From Madrid–Barajas Airport, participants can travel to Madrid city center and then continue to Córdoba by high-speed train.

By Train

Train travel is one of the fastest and most recommended ways to reach Córdoba. Córdoba is served by Córdoba Central Train Station, located close to the city center and well connected to Spain's high-speed rail network.

From Madrid, high-speed AVE trains reach Córdoba in approximately 1 hour 45 minutes.

From Seville, the journey takes around 45 minutes.

From Málaga, travel time is approximately 1 hour.

Train tickets can be purchased online via Renfe or at train stations.

By Bus

Long-distance buses offer an affordable alternative to trains and connect Córdoba with many Spanish cities. Direct bus routes are available from Madrid, Seville, Málaga, and Granada.

Buses arrive at Córdoba Bus Station, located next to the train station and within easy reach of the city center. Bus tickets can be booked online through bus company websites or at bus terminals.

Overall, Córdoba is easily accessible for international participants by flying into a major Spanish airport and continuing the journey by train or bus.

Please note that check-in to the rooms is after 2:00 pm and check-out is until 11:00 am.

PROJECT RULES
